From the Rector:

So many of us have been asking, "Will spring ever get here this year?" It has seemed so dark with all of the rain and cloudy days – more fall-like than spring. It takes effort to keep our minds and our moods focused on the light

doesn't it? At the same time we are in the wonderful and festive 50 days of Easter, in which we have been focusing on Jesus as the light in our darkness. I ran across these words from Bishop Steven Charleston that I found very fitting to this image of Christ.

"We have all been to the dark places, that shadow land just next door to what we call reality, where clarity is lost and doubt dwells, where we are uncertain what tomorrow will bring, if tomorrow can come at all. The dark places can appear slowly or suddenly, but either way they cover us in a fog of doubt, leaving us feeling alone. It is at this moment that faith becomes our compass, for it reminds us that darkness is only a detour, never a destination. These small corners are not the true landscape of our life. They cannot contain the power of love. We have only to listen to our heart. Then the Spirit calls for us until we find our way, out of the dead-end of worry, and back to the broad and bright streets of hope" (Accessed April 26, 2018).

We know that Jesus is our light, our way out of the darkness that sometimes comes and seems to surround and envelop us. It is faith, the gift that God gives us, that also surrounds and heals us; that pushes the darkness away and brings us back into the light – the light of Christ in this world with us. I don't know about you, but I am beginning to see the signs of light and spring. As I write these words the sun is out and the sky is bluer than it has been in a while. Flowers are blooming; the willow trees are yellowing; there are red buds on the trees, and the air is warmer. All signs of lightness and spring.

What are the signs we see that let us know that Jesus is leading us from darkness into light? Is it a feeling? Is it something we observe? Is it something that we observe in others or that we do ourselves? I believe that it is different for each of us, depending on how we experience God in our lives. It can be as simple as the smile given to or received from a stranger, an act of kindness freely given, feeling grateful for blessings recognized, knowing that we are held in prayer by our community, or, thanking God for the beauty of nature as spring opens to light and new life.

Several of us attended a presentation by Diana Butler-Bass April 21. She made a statement that really resonated with me and helps me know that Jesus is our light: "The resurrection does not erase the incarnation". We are in the season of special attention to the resurrection, the Great Fifty Days of Easter; where faith and hope spring anew; where light overcomes the darkness. I think what Diana was saying is that as amazing as the resurrection is, we must not lose sight of the incarnation – God walking as human, learning and knowing what our darkness is like and how desperately we need the light that Jesus brings to us. This knowledge and understanding from our Lord is truly the gift of faith. We are Christ's own and as such we are called to live in the light and to be light for others.

Psalm 27 begins "The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid? The answer is "fear not", because we have light, we have faith and we have hope. Darkness be gone!

EVANGELISM

Starting MAY 26TH we will have a booth at the Willoughby Open Market on the 4th Saturday of the month through September 22nd. Please join us to say hello, and get to know people in the community. The booth will be open from 8:00 am to noon. You can volunteer for 1 to 4 hours of your time. Set up will be handled by Frank Burkacki and Chris Burke. While you are there you can walk the market to see what is available. The Boy Scouts, McKinley outreach center, Cub Scouts, and Forbes House volunteers have been invited to share the table with us on different weeks from June -September. Sign up or talk to Peggy Burkacki about volunteering. The dates will be as follows: June 23rd, July 28th, August 25th, and September 28th.

OLD SPIRAL STAIRS

Long-Range Planning team, with Vestry approval, has deemed the circular stair, located near the Sacristy, surplus to our anticipated needs and recommends its removal. Jr. Warden David Webster is accepting offers from parishioners for its purchase. If no parishioner is interested, it will be offered to the public. Deadline for offers is 1 June 2018. Buyer is responsible for its removal. It is five feet in diameter with a floor to floor height of 10' 6". Installed during the 1957 construction of the current church building, it is no longer compliant with the 2018 Ohio Building Code, because vertical handrail supports are too widely spaced. Buyer is required to sign an acknowledgement that they are buying it "as is" and that it may have lead-based paint (but unproven). The church will be responsible for covering the hole in the floor.

After its removal, the upper level will be used to store acolyte robes, banners and other worship-related equipment. The lower level will provide for increased Boy Scout and Cub Scout equipment storage.

NEMAC

The Northeast Mission Area Council, or NEMAC meets at Grace quarterly. The 1st meeting, held April 23, was well attended. Our own Margaret Dodds chaired this group for several years now, and has retired from that position. A new chair and secretary was elected. Bob Thompson of Epiphany, Euclid will serve as Chairperson, and Linda Webb from St. Christopher's by the River, Gates Mills, will serve as Secretary. Many thanks to Margaret for her great leadership and dedication to the Mission Area Council. She remains on council, for Grace Church.


