From the Rector:

On another note – I have had some people express their concern that I have been too political of late. There has been a lot going on in our country that affects our common life and we all have differing views on what is the "correct" position. My response to this is that I value each of you and your individual positions. It is OK to have different positions. What is not OK, in my mind, is to stop talking to each other about our differences. When we talk to one another we can often times find some common ground that we can stand on together. While we may still have differences, we can lean into our commonalities and come together on that common ground, no matter how small it is.

I for one, no longer want to play in the "blame game". I no longer want to hear who did what, or did it first or to whom – I just want us to work together to fix the problem causing the difference. I want us to find ways that are loving, compassionate, and in keeping with the Gospel and laws of our country that allow us to "respect the dignity of every human being".

You have read my response; now here is my prayer: I pray that love will prevail and that when I speak of the conditions that affect humanity, God's creation and all of God's children, you hear the Gospel, not politics. I

pray that my heart and my mouth stay firmly in the Gospel, and that no matter what – we never stop having the hard conversations. You have my thanks, love and respect for hanging in and listening.




