From the Rector:

Well, here we are on the other side of Christmas, We have celebrated Epiphany, the arrival of the Magi, and are moving into the days after Epiphany – Ordinary time that takes us to Ash Wednesday and Lent. The seasons of the church move on, whether or not we are ready for it. What shall we do with this

Ordinary time? Here at Grace, there is much to be done.

One important thing that we need to attend to is scheduled for February 3. That's the date of our Annual meeting, where we elect new members of our Vestry. It appears that we will have a contested election this year and I am very excited by that prospect. This tells me that we have more than one or two people who are ready and willing to serve on the body that manages the business of our parish, determines how our resources are used and works to envision what God has in mind for our future as Grace church. The Vestry is most effective when they function as a team. That takes dedication and focus; a willingness to engage in Gods Holy work for the good of the parish rather than individual good.

An article by Chris Holmes in the January 2019 issue of ECF Vital Practices describes the successful Vestry team. He writes:

"Life-giving teams build community and synergy around a higher purpose while utilizing the gifts of each member of the team. This kind of a team doesn't just sort of happen. It is the consequence of a process of careful selection, intentional development and team leader training.

The first thing to realize about teamwork is that a team is fundamentally different from a group. Groups come together for sharing or learning and then apply that learning to their individual lives. Teams develop a common vision with established goals, and rise or fall together because their members share responsibility for the results of their work.

The church Vestry is innately designed to function as a team with shared responsibility for church governance, structure and selection. It holds a place at the top of the local congregation's organizational structure, with the purpose of helping the congregation fulfill its mission. The best of vestry life happens when the organization functions as a team accomplishing its work productively and collaboratively. ...

From the Rector, continued:

A research study involving thousands of teams identified as effective, found these six common actors:

- Effective teams have a compelling direction. The purpose for meeting is captivating and clear and the team is able to measure what success looks like.
- The right people are on the team for the right reasons. Most often these are stakeholders in the mission of the organization who have the ability to play well with others.
- Team membership is well defined. There is utter clarity about who is on the team and who is not. You would be surprised at how often this is unclear.
- The team matters to the organization and its leadership. The team is given enough authority to carry importance, has an adequate budget and undisputed organizational buy-in.
- The structure of the team is solid. There is administrative support, a reasonable time-line, role definition and clarity about critical details.
- The team is adequately led/coached. The leader of the team is trained and has a good grasp of working with others.

The study on Team Effectiveness found that when the first five of these factors are in place, there is a 60% chance that the team will be effective in doing its work. The other 40 percent chance of success in effectiveness depends upon the quality of leadership provided to the team."

We at Grace have been blessed with Vestries that form well-functioning teams with strong Wardens who have led with wisdom and competence. I have no reason to think that that will change.

The Vestry represents you, so I urge you to know your candidates (see the bios of those running elsewhere in this PACE), to pray for your Vestry as they do the work God has given them to do, and to support them with your presence and partnership. We are all on this journey together.

I found this prayer in the New Zealand Prayer Book (pg. 125), which I have put on a post-it note and keep on my desk as a reminder of what we are called to: "God, give us work until our life shall end and life until our work is done." Let us do God's work together as we strive to be the hand, feet and heart of Christ in this world.

I hope to see each of you at the Annual meeting!
