From the Rector:



It seems that it was just yesterday that we gathered to observe Ash Wednesday, and, that I was able to "invite you, in the name of the Church, to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word. And, to make a right beginning of repentance, ..." (BCP p 265). As I write this, we are already passing week 3 of the season of Lent and looking to contemplating Jesus walk to Jerusalem, his

triumphant entry leading to his suffering, death and resurrection.

Just as you were invited to a Holy Lent, I invite you to immerse yourself in the journey that Christ accomplished during that last week. There are many opportunities to walk with Jesus through Holy Week and to gain new and/or deeper understanding of the Easter experience. Beginning Palm Sunday, there are services every evening here at Grace, with a couple of exceptions. The North East Area Mission Council (NEMAC) is sponsoring a joint Easter Vigil at 7:00 pm Saturday April 20, at St. Andrew, Mentor. This is the second year of the joint vigil. It was a moving and spiritual experience to worship with our fellow Episcopalians from the other parishes in the mission area. I urge you to plan to attend. I believe that you will find it to be a worthwhile experience in your journey to Easter. This is in addition to our all-night vigil that begins following the Maundy Thursday service. (Please see the schedule of services elsewhere in this PACE edition.)

Are you asking, "Why? Why so many services that week? Why spend such a large block of time at church?" The answer to the why is Jesus.

As you walk through Lent, have you discovered Jesus calling us to watch and wait with him as he prepares himself to offer his whole self on our behalf? We prepare as well, readying ourselves to be the hands and feet of Christ in this world, walking with God's love and sharing that love with all we meet. So come, watch, wait and pray your way through the journey, so that Jesus can walk with us throughout the rest of the year.

A Lenten Message from Presiding Bishop Michael Curry

This Lenten season, our thoughts turn to the story at the heart of our faith — Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection. Jesus was crucified because he taught a radical message: Love God. Love your neighbor. It's a message that lives and sustains us 2,000 years later.

Love was on Jesus' mind the night before he died. At the Last Supper, he said to his disciples, "A new commandment I give you" — not a new *option*, mind you, but a new *commandment* — "that you love one another."

I am convinced that love is the key to life. I'm also convinced that the opposite of love is not hate but selfishness, and that hatred is merely a derivative of selfishness. Love, on the other hand, is the cure. And I have no doubt that when it comes to love and unselfishness, you are doing a pretty good job! Your donations to Episcopal Relief & Development are an expression of this unstoppable, all-powerful love.

I have the good fortune of being the honorary chair of Episcopal Relief & Development's Board of Directors, and I've witnessed firsthand the profound impact your contributions have. Next Meetings


