That is how long God has been working though our parish and the people of Grace to show God's love in this world. Grace Church was chartered May 15, 1870. The "old" Grace Church building still stands in Willoughby. It was finished in

1883 and it is still in use! That is just a couple of the facts that we will be learning and sharing this year as we celebrate our meaningful history.

The 105<sup>th</sup> Anniversary team has been hard at work planning events that will make our celebration memorable. The people giving generously of their time are Jeanne Schupp, Pat Newyear, Ken Hughes, Walt Iliff, Dave Ivey, Kathy Hill, Cathy Nash and Thora Scott. We learn new and fun facts every time we meet. The team made a trip to Trinity Commons to visit the Diocesan Archives, where the Rev. Dr. Brian Wilbert, Archivist, shared his knowledge and vast historical collections with us. There is a folder just for Grace Willoughby resting in the archives.

It is our intention to celebrate this anniversary all year long. A special dinner planned for Saturday, May 2 at St. Noel's Banquet Center. Please save the date! We are also exploring doing a Sunday morning service as it would have been done in 1873. Other events under consideration include a choral evensong, a community festival in the front parking lot, and re-creating the play performed at the church's 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration. A commemorative video is being produced through Dave Ivey and his connection with Auburn Career Center. This video is the senior project for videography students at Auburn. Not only does Grace provide God's good things in the community, we receive blessings all the time.

The plans are coming along but remain fluid, so if you're interested in helping with planning these special events please join the team at their next meeting. The date and time is published in our Sunday announcements.

#### A letter to Grace Episcopal Church from the Rev. Deacon Lydia Bailey

Dear Grace Church:

I am so thoroughly fond of you as a congregation and those I have begun to know over my last 2 1/2 years here. Mother Rose Anne, you are such a compassionate, level-headed friend for me, and true pastor for all of Grace. Seminarian Noah, I love following your walk to ordination. Your regard for all the parishioners at Grace is evident and genuine.

I have been commissioned by a Foundation to do a photography project, photographing the women at Norma Herr Women's Shelter in Cleveland—and also to write their stories, which require unhurried time getting to know the individuals. This will be a formal exhibit, to be done with lots of careful work. Because this will be in addition to my full-time work at LMM's Men's Shelter in Cleveland, and not overlapping it, I need to pull back from being a deacon here at Grace. There simply are not enough hours in day without scrimping on the most important thing, which is my family.

As a deacon, I have seen your wonderful relationships in the community of Willoughby and I think that's where my deacon-work with you would lay. But I simply don't have the capacity to help you in your ministry of fostering relations here in this community. On a limited basis, I will continue to be a deacon at St. Christopher's Church in Gates Mills. The church is involved at the shelter where I work, with individuals and groups volunteering, so that I can keep my focus consolidated around this urban ministry at the shelter.

I am fond of all of you. I have loved doing my monthly Scripture study here with you, Jane Schierloh & participants- and the stories we've shared stay with me. Now onwards, with creative work in Willoughby & beyond! Thank you to you-the good people of Grace Church. With your gentleness & love, with your eyes for the world around you, Grace Parishioners, you are mighty in Spirit.


Worship engages our deepest human needs and has the power to transform our lives. Join the Brothers of SSJE in exploring the signs and symbols at the heart of Christian worship.

Stewardship: e-giving offering cards in the pews.


#### Worship:
