**Little Feet:** Kathy Hill and Mother Rose Anne met with Diana, the Family Liaison at Edison Elementary School, regarding a shopping date for Little Feet. We will be working with Don at JCPenney as in the past. There is a possibility of working with Marshall's also. Since this meeting with Diana, the shopping date has been postponed until after the new year.

Friends of Recovery: Kathy Ivey has been in touch with Dennis Anthony as to what we can do to help them. They would like food prepared for men or women's weekly meetings. There are usually 20 to 30 attendees. Further information to follow. We continue to collect cleaning supplies for the 2 recovery houses. Boxes are provided on the pew across from the offices.

Forbes House: We continue to collect non-perishable food items and cleaning supplies. We also began collecting unused greeting cards and stamps that can be used by the residents and staff.

#### Evangelism Updates from Peggy Burkacki and the Evangelism Team

Christmas gifts for Groups: Due to the COVID-19 virus, we cannot provide homemade cookies for the 12-step groups meeting at the Church, as we have done in years past. Still, we want to assure the groups we haven't forgotten them. We discussed giving them some sort of gift that they are able to keep (possibly with Grace's name on it) along with a snack.

Embracing Evangelism: The final Embracing Evangelism session was held November 12. I think we all learned a lot from these sessions, even things about each other that we may not have known before. Our group seemed to mesh well and be very enjoyable. I think each individual took away something different. I was glad to have Dave Zimmerman as my co-facilitator. Besides being easy to work with he did a wonderful job of keeping us on track and keeping up with Zoom. We are planning on getting feedback from our group to see where we go from here and see if it is something we want to open again to the congregation.

**2021 Stewardship Campaign Results:** The number of pledge this year was 39. That is four fewer than last year. A total of \$84,088 was pledged. That's down \$6,686 from our 2020 pledge total of \$90,774. This was not unexpected. After dealing with the pandemic all year we thought the pledge numbers might be down. When we looked closer at the pledges this year, we are very impressed with the continued generosity of the members of Grace.

Out of 39 total pledges 28 people increased their pledges for next year. Wow! There was one new pledge. Five people decreased their pledges for various reasons and 5 stayed the same. The main decrease in total pledge dollars was not from the virus, but from those parishioners who passed away of natural causes. Grace church did receive very generous Legacy Giving from a few who had passed.

Well done, family of Grace! Thank you for your supporting Grace church in these difficult times.

As is our custom, the Giving Envelopes with your assigned number (for tax purposes) will be set out on tables with the Christmas cards in the sanctuary.

Fellowship: Online Coffee Hour is doing well.







#### **Renovations Continue!**




