From the Rev. Rose Anne Lonsway:



It is so great to say hello to you all after my time away. I missed seeing you all and hearing your voices!

Thank you all for your warm welcome and support of Fr. Moorer. From everything I heard he took wonderful care of you all in my absence. Many thanks to you Dawson – I am most appreciative of your ministry here at Grace!

While I was away from you, I spent time relishing God's beautiful creation and admiring God's artwork in the

colorful arrival of fall. This got me to thinking about how our lives have changed over the past almost two years and wondering how they will continue to change in our future. I participated in many webinars and podcasts and heard a lot of discussion about where we are as a society, about the increasing secularization of the world around us, and the loss of kindness and trust. These things are so apparent in what we hear, see, and read throughout the various media formats. In both religious media and popular media outlets, I found great focus on how we are perceived as church, as opposed to who we strive to be as followers of Jesus. I heard a great deal of discussion about how the Church universal has failed: at best it is accused of turning a blind eye to injustice and oppression and at worst, participating in it. It spite of it all, I do not for one minute believe that God is finished with God's church.

What has become apparent to me is that we need to seriously consider what we need to be, and what we are called to change, to show us the path God would have us follow for the next 150 years of Grace. We have a wonderful history to carry us forward to our future and we will build on that.

I wish I could tell you that I have the answers we need, but alas, I do not. Some of you have heard me say this and you also heard me say that I believe that the answer will be found when we work together to discern the way. We have a lot of work to do to get there, however. There are some hard truths that we need to recognize. Those truths include how to better love all our neighbors, how to look into ourselves to recognize those places in ourselves that are still a little rough around differences of opinions, philosophies, theologies, and cultures, and how to move out into the community around us to bring Jesus alive for everyone God brings to our paths. We also can look to identify areas of commonality where we can learn, discuss, and perhaps even disagree as friends, as neighbors.

Please drop your pledge card in the mail, or drop it off at the church.



Thanks, Father Dawson! The Vestry thanked The Rev. Dawson Moorer for his service to Grace during Mother Rose Anne's sabbatical.




