From the Rev. Rose Anne Lonsway:



This year seems to have begun in a flurry of activity. There is a lot happening at Grace and in the Diocese. Here at Grace, I have held several small group meetings with those of you who chose to chat with me and look ahead to the future of our parish. We have begun our Mutual Ministry Review with in-person and Zoom meetings, where we discussed what Grace has, does, and means to us and to the community we live in, and to begin

to discern where God is calling us in our next 150 years. Our consultant, Fr. Albert Jennings, will interview me and the Vestry, so that your Vestry has information to inform discernment and God's calling.

February 6 will find us at our Annual Meeting, coming together to carry out our work – electing new Vestry members, recognizing and thanking those who have served, and updating our by-laws. We are accomplishing all of this as we navigate and negotiate Covid avoidance. I am so thankful and grateful to God and to you all for keeping us going and hanging in these past long, difficult two years. Let's work to keep it up. We have come too far to lose heart now! Each and every one of you are critical to our future. You are each loved and valued.

As if that were not enough to keep us occupied, we are entering the process of searching for a new bishop. The following is the initial information about the process, and I urge you to read the reports being disseminated and to get involved. We have been well-supported for the last 18 years by Bishop Hollingsworth. Be a part of the future of the Diocese, as well as the future of Grace. Stay tuned, read, learn, and participate as you can. Plan to attend the listening sessions when they are announced and plan to be a part of the walk abouts as you are able so that sound decisions will be made. Here some key dates to keep in mind:

March-May, 2022 – Application Review and First Round of Interviews August 4-6, 2022 – Discernment Retreat with Semi-finalists

August 15, 2022 – Initial Slate Announced August 16-30, 2022 – Petition Period Sontomber 1, 2022 – Announce Final Slate

September 1, 2022 – Announce Final Slate October 21-28, 2022 – Meet and Greet with Diocese

Hi Phil,





November 18-19, 2022 – Electing Convention *To be determined* – Ordination and Consecration

The Bishop Search Committee has posted the Search Profile on the Diocesan website (https://dohio.org/), which now has a section devoted to the Bishop Search Process. This information can be accessed directly from the dohio.org home page. The Search Committee also is busy planning the listening process which will begin in February. From the Committee:

"The listening process provides an important opportunity for every member of the diocese to share in the Search Committee's work. We invite all lay and clergy members of the Diocese of Ohio to gather as the body of Christ, bonded by our Baptismal Covenant, and eager to develop further our prayer for the next Bishop of Ohio. Sessions will be offered virtually and in person throughout the Diocese. Participants will have an opportunity to respond to open-ended questions provided in advance for prayerful consideration. These questions will solicit your ideas and thoughts to inform the Search Committee's review of applications and interview of candidates. All comments will be treated with care and consideration. In closing, we ask for your continued prayers.

Loving Creator, you call us together and you send us forth to be your witnesses in all places. We ask you now to lead us, accompany us, and direct us as we seek that person who is to be our next Bishop. Grant us perception, faithfulness, and joy that we may hear your still small voice. And then, give us the courage to follow as you lead us along the way. In the name of Christ Jesus who is the shepherd and bishop of our souls. Amen."

- Debbie Zimmerman did a great job decorating the bulletin boards downstairs.
- Jo Bennett, Cathy Nash and Sue Mancino decorated the tree downstairs for the Groups. It looked so beautiful!
- Many thanks to everyone who made contributions of their many talents and time and worked so hard to help make the holidays happier for so many this year.

New ideas for Outreach in 2022:

- Walt suggested a scrap metal collection in lieu of a rummage sale this year. Any metal including appliances can be included. This could be a year-round project.
- At Peggy's suggestion, Grace is now supporting Donna's Christmas Trees. This is a nonprofit group in Lake County called Donna's Christmas Trees, which collects unwanted

Christmas trees, ornaments, and decorations and throughout the year. They refurbish these items for distribution to families and facilities that are in need of some help during the Christmas Season. We are collecting items to be given to them, so if you have any extra or unnecessary Christmas items please bring them to church.

Future of Outreach and Evangelism Teams: It was decided that the Evangelism and Outreach team meetings should be combined. The two teams will continue to have separate chairs and distinct missions, but will meet together to combine and coordinate resources. Rector's Report:

- Annual Meeting format:

 - Need quorum for the meeting to take place. If a parishioner intends to vote they need to be physically present for the meeting as we don't have a way to handle hybrid voting at this time. No meal will be served.
