

Evangelism Updates:

- Inviting People to Church: Inviting people back to church was discussed. It was decided to send postcards with a picture of Grace as an invitation.

- Willoughby Outdoor Market: Chris Burke purchased a 10 x 10 tent in order to be compliant with the market's space restrictions. May 21 will be the first day that Grace will participate in the market. A sign-up sheet with the schedule of the dates we will participate will be available for those who wish to help out.
- Bike Blessing May 22: Flyers will be made and distributed to various shops and clubs by team members.
- Prayer boxes: New prayer boxes are in the works, one for upstairs and one for downstairs.
 More details coming soon.

"Striving for Hope" Walk / Virtual


