From The Rector November 2022 Dear Friends,

We are Drawing closer to the election of our Bishop Coadjutor, and I hope that you all have had an opportunity to read about and listen to the three nominees. I had the privilege of

spending time with them during Meet and Greet week and I have come to understand what a difficult decision we have ahead of us. The difficulty of this decision makes it even more important that each of you pray that the Holy Spirit lead us to the candidate of God's choice. That will happen when we all do our due diligence and discernment and share our thoughts with our convention delegates, who will be voting as your representatives. Don't forget that I have a vote as well as delegates Elizabeth Estep, David Webster, and David Zimmerman. Alternates are Mary Miragliotta and Greg Mackey and they need to be as prepared as the delegates in case they are called on to fill in for a delegate. This is such important work for us and for our Diocese; please help us hear the Holy Spirit.

There are a few things coming up beside convention that you may want to know about.

1. Many thanks to Elizabeth Estep and Toni Swisher for their great work on our fall Stewardship activities. We are reminded that we are the beneficiaries of God's great love and abundance – knowing that it is always enough. If you have not yet committed to supporting our parish over the next year, it is not too late to turn in a card. There are extras on the table at the entrance. Your commitment to Grace Church is a commitment to God and allows us to become the hands and feet of Christ in our community, spreading His love in the world.






