From the Rector January/February 2023

Welcome 2023! As we prepare to enter the second month of the year already, we are busy preparing for our Annual Meeting, scheduled for the first Sunday in February – 02/05/23.

Thanks to Kathy Ivey, Cathy Nash and Debbie Zimmerman, we will enjoy a bagel bar, complete with yogurt and fruit to get us through our work. There is one service only that Sunday at 9:00 a.m. and the meeting will follow upstairs in the Gathering Space. There will be a zoom option available, however I am still trying to figure out how those who are not present can vote, so stay tuned please.

I believe that it is really important to be here for the Annual Meeting in person if it is at all possible, not only for forming a strong community, but to hear your voice as we celebrate our accomplishments in mission over the past year and work together to discern what God would have us plan for 2023. I so look forward to seeing you there!

I make a point of this because I believe that, like so many other churches, we are struggling to figure out who and how we can be post COVID. I believe we are in a recovery phase and just like recovery from physical or emotional disabilities, we need a good plan of care for our parish and for one another. We need to develop this plan together, so I urge you to be an active part of this plan development. It is time for us to Show up, Stand up, and Pray for our future. We have 152 years under our belt, and I do not believe that God is done with us yet!

From the Rector (continued), Let us consider holding close what scripture tells us God desires of us: Micah 6:8 tells us that: "8He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the LORD require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?" The New Testament continues those instructions as Jesus plainly tells us in Matthew 22: 37-40 ... "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. 38This is the greatest and first commandment. 39And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. 40On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets."

Let's spend some time concentrating on these guiding words. One of the things we will discuss at the meeting is the best timing to begin coming together for a practice called Centering Prayer, or Contemplative Prayer. I believe that I have discerned a need for us to place more emphasis on our spirituality and one way to do that is to spend more time in prayer. This type of prayer is described by Fr. Richard Rohr, a Catholic brother, as: "Centering Prayer is simply sitting in silence, open to God's love and your love for God. This prayer is beyond thoughts, emotions, or sensations. Like being with a very close friend or lover, where words are not required, Centering Prayer brings your relationship with God to a level deeper than conversation, to pure communion." (quoted from Richard Rohr's daily email meditations)

I plan to begin our sessions with Lectio Divina, method of bible study, and then move into a time of centering prayer. I envision spending about an hour a week, beginning with learning how to accomplish both of these activities. There are many rewards, both individual and as a community to be reaped from intentional time with God outside of the time of formal worship. I pray you will pledge to give this a try.

You all remain in my prayers as we work on finding our way to what God has in store for us.




