From the Rev. Rose Anne Lonsway:



Dear Friends, In order to ensure that everyone sees the letter from Mother Rose Anne, here it is in it's entirety.

Many of you know that the canons of the Episcopal Church require ordained persons to retire at age 72. I have been extremely blessed that our Bishop has, as allowed by the canons, granted me permission to remain your Rector beyond that expectation. After much prayer and deliberation, I have determined that now is the appropriate time and therefore, effective July 1, 2023, I will retire. Several factors influenced this decision, and I will be happy to discuss them with you individually if you would like to do so.

It has been a great honor to serve as your Rector for the last eight years and I pray that I have served you in a way that allowed you to serve our Lord with joy and peace in your hearts and souls. I believe that we have been faithful to the work that our God has given us to do. We, like many other parishes, have experienced the weight of the changes and challenges brought on by COVID and while those changes have impacted our sense of well-being and our efforts to bring new souls to faith, you have stayed the course, and I believe, stand ready to continue to explore ways to re-engage as an active and growing parish. We have truly been blessed in many ways, and I know that you all will continue to bring the light of Christ into our community.

My last Sunday with you will be May 28, which is Pentecost. What a wonderful day to celebrate new beginnings and being open to exploring where and how the Holy Spirit will lead and send us. I will then take accrued time off until the stated retirement date.

Vestry Highlights March 2023

Treasurer's Report: Pledges down for month but ahead for the year, Wells Fargo accounts lost again this month,

Senior Warden: Help needed on Fellowship committee, the Giving Corner by the basement stairs cleaned up, Hope Chest bin to be moved, two new people joined Stewardship Committee

Junior Warden: Capital projects for 2023 allocated \$44,000 in improvements, -Kitchen 38% (\$18,000) for new ceiling/lighting/kitchen stove, carpeting Narthex, and stairs 7%, grounds, trees, fencing 18%, exterior painting (partial) and repairs 11%, other 20% covered walkway at front door to be checked out, needs to come all the way up to the door of building. Church vestments-old church vestments are in the way of cabinets in Sacristy, suggestions are: rack to be put on brick wall or use closet shelves or combine with robes in other closet in lobby- vestments may be used by visiting clergy or donated? Kitchen deep cleaned by cleaning company. Choir loft needs cleaned out to use for storage, shelves for organ speakers need to be hung, scaffolding needed over stairs to get shelves hung and speakers off the floor.

Rector's report: Centering Prayer questionnaires discussed to determine what day/time-looks like Tuesday afternoon in person or via ZOOM is best. Scout Pancake Breakfast Palm Sunday-Scouts to cook/serve, Walt Iliff to buy supplies. Someone is needed for IT/zoom, maybe change zoom times to 1 or 2x's a month? Phil Davis suggested to inquire @ South High for a student interested in IT to work part-time @ church for pay.

Stewardship-report given under Senior Warden

Outreach: McKinley will start serving meals again after roof repaired and new kitchen floor put in, Rummage sale will probably hold off until next year, First monetary donation of the year given to McKinley, Donna's Christmas Tree's to be called to pick up donations, Kathy Hill retired as team leader, Chris Burke to head Outreach.

Evangelism: Cathy Nash inquired about CPR from Fire Dept.- they need a head count, maybe open it up to the community/scouts, Herb Garden discussed - maybe enlarge it, Willoughby Market one Saturday a month or 2x's per season this year, Soup/Salad Hymn Sing discussed.

Worship: Palm Cross Workshop on 4/1/2023 at 10am Saturday, Saturday Easter Vigil will be at Trinity Cathedral

Pastoral Care: two meals taken.

Other Business: Use of Prayer Book after Lent discussed instead of a bulletin.

- Altar Guild Building & Grounds is waiting for countertops to arrive for completion of cabinet install in the Sacristy.
- 2. Sunday School Arianna is coming every other week for now. She may come every Sunday beginning in May.
- 3. Choir –The Seasonal Brass will pull together a group for our Easter service. Scott will pursue updating the Praise book. We need to be selective in our choices and careful that we use only Copyrighted selections.
  - 4. Review of services and events Ash Wednesday no comments, Morning Prayer - short and sweet. There were a variety of comments, many positive.
  - 5. Upcoming Services Holy Week, Altar color is red. Palm Sunday April 2 We will have 100 palms. Need someone to lead making palm crosses. Rose Anne will check with Charlotte regarding teaching people to make crosses. Stations of the cross are up. We discussed leaving stations up year-around. It was decided to just put them up early as we did this year. There is an 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. service and a pancake breakfast scheduled for Palm Sunday.

- 6. Deep cleaning will be done in the kitchen tomorrow, 3/13. We will have 1 residential size stove for now. There is discussion about having 2 residential stoves at some point.

#### Outreach -


- McKinley Update McKinley will offer meals after the new roof is completed. A new floor was installed in McKinley's kitchen.
