- Increase to \$50,000 for director/rector salary, out of Grace Woods funds, motion to accept treasure report by Kathy Hill, 2nd by Walt Iliff, motion accepted.

Interim Rector's Report

- Feed back from liturgy change, Prayers of the People, responses not always good.
- Revisions needed for search committee, expectation period will be approximately 2 years, consult period compensation possibly could be \$2,000 plus expenses, Re. Dawson Moorer to be search consultant, trained by diocese. There are many openings in the diocese. Motion made to have Rev. Dawson Moorer as search consultant by Walt Iliff, 2nd by Elizabeth Estep. Motion carried, liaison to vestry needed.
