There's frost on the pumpkins! Autumn in Northeast Ohio is quite beautiful, and this year is no different. The changes outside mimic our changing liturgical year. The Last Sunday after Pentecost is called Christ the King Sunday which is followed of course by the First Sunday of Advent on November 30<sup>th</sup> this year. Advent is all about preparation. Preparing for the Second Coming of Christ and the First Coming of the Christ Child. In the lectionary, the prescribed readings for each Sunday, if we pay attention, are pointing to the Second Coming of Christ a couple weeks *before* Advent.

As a parish in transition, we are preparing to call a new Rector. There is new energy in the Search Committee which is working diligently to once again update the Parish Profile. They are interested in why you come to Gace so faithfully every week. Why are you attracted to this place? What would you like to say to a member of the clergy who is seeking a new call? I'll finish up with a prayer which I find comforting in times of uncertainty. It was written by Reinhold Niebuhr at the beginning of WWII. You'll likely be familiar with the beginning of the Serenity Prayer, but you may not know the rest of the story:

God, grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, the courage to change the things that I can, and the wisdom to know the difference. Living one day at a time, enjoying one moment at a time. Taking, as Jesus did, this sinful world as it is, not as I would have it. Trusting that You will make all things right, if I but surrender to Your will. So that I may be reasonably happy in this life and supremely happy with You forever in the next. Amen.

I hope and pray that this prayer grants you comfort in this time of preparation and transition.

We have distributed over 140,000 lbs. of food - Produce, meats & bread/bakery.

We have served 1423 households, a total of 3641 people, and 145 were new households in need right here in our local communities.

Distributed to people in need of medical equipment, walkers, wheelchairs, canes etc.

Our faithful Servants have donated 4217 hours of their valuable time. (50 active volunteers).

Dural medical equipment/ incontinent supplies /baby diapers & wipes pet food/ shoes / books/ Bibles and Spiritual books in our Chapel.


